Designed by architect Philip Johnson and John Burgee, Christ Cathedral was completed in 1980, and was then known as Crystal Cathedral in February 2012, the cathedral was purchased by the Diocese of Orange. Since then, the cathedral has undergone extensive renovations

Pastoral Center

The Pastoral Center is home to the offices of The Most Rev. Kevin Vann, Bishop of Orange, and headquarters for the ministries of the Diocese and the Orange Catholic Foundation.

While Christ Cathedral has been undergoing its renovation, the Arboretum has served members of the parish by hosting Masses delivered in English, Spanish, and Vietnamese.
