

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
THE PRESIDENT'S CORNER



HOW TO CHANGE OUT TONNEAU STRUTS ON A C6 CONVERTIBLE

Hey PCC'rs,

It's time for a lesson in repairing the struts on my tonneau lid. **First**, you have to be 140 lbs so you can climb into the trunk of a 2013 convertible. **It also helps to be 6'4"** so you don't have to get in the trunk. The original first lesson. Go on-line to watch a YouTube video on where to look and what to look for. Check.✓



The Regional Membership Director (RMD) position for the West Coast-Northwest NCCC region has become available.

The RMD responsibilities are as follows:

The RMD should have a working knowledge of the RMD Membership Database functions.

The RMD should have a working knowledge of the Governor's Membership Database functions.

The RMD should maintain their password in the database and never give it to anyone.

The RMD should process club members within 12 hours of receiving a club or MAL check. (go to bank one or twice a month)

The RMDs should complete all yearly renewals by the date they set or by Dec 15th. Once a new member or renewing member is entered into the database, the governor shall mail a check and all NCCC applications to the RMD via USPS.

The RMD reports to the VP of Membership and when possible attend the National Meeting and report back to the Region.

ANOTHER FRIENDLY TIP

Good afternoon all...it's me again William Rose, for another friendly tip for your C7. If you are thinking about changing your side marker lights, let me tell you what I ran into while doing mine.

I wanted to get rid of the orange and red marker OEM lights for something led and make it more appealing to the eye. My first thought was to go with smoked marker lights with leds. I decided to go with Vette lights. I ordered the smoked lights as shown here.

I had just changed my rims during this time as well. This is important as you will see.

After changing the lights and rims and driving at night when I get off from work, I noticed that I had a right-side front tire pressure was just two - dashes.



This is the first set of marker lights I installed. They interfered with the TPMS.

TPMS (tire pressure Maintenance sensor) light come on. This light would only come on at night. I checked pressures and all was good. I thought since I just got my rims changed it might have been a broken TPMS sensor. I noticed on one of rims that it had a defect in the chrome. I reached out to the rim company, and they said we will order a new rim, and have you come in when it is ready. So, I thought I will buy a new sensor and have them install it. Job went well all good. At night the TPMS light came out same - same location. I found out that the lights were causing the issue I read it in a Corvette forum. The led lights give off the same signal or so close to the same signal as the TPMS and after 12 miles driving at night the TPMS light comes on. I tried putting aluminum foil around the lights and noise suppression on the wires to the light to block the signal that was interrupting the signal to the TPMS. Nothing seemed to work. I reached out to Vette Lights, and they told me that some people have been having the same problem and that Orical lights were the only ones that did not have this problem. They were kind enough to give me back the money I spent on these lights and put it towards the new Orical lights. Orical has many more options. You can have smoked, painted, or what I did is have them painted but the led section was smoked. A little more money, but no TPMS light and they look great to me.



This is the Orical marker light. It did not interfere with the TPMS.

Well, that's my story. I hope this helps anyone thinking to change out your marker lights. Go with Orical. Vette Lights is a great place to shop. https://www.vette-lights.com
