
An Oasis not to be missed.

Someday you may be able to drive to a superhighway, turn the controls over to a guidance system, and travel across the country in high-speed safety—with nothing to do but twiddle your thumbs.

Buick's experimental Century Cruiser is a glimpse of that day

In manual operation the driver steers with pistol grips positioned in the arm rests. To change direction he moves one or both backward or forward. To regulate speed he simply squeezes or releases them.

As he enters the automated highway he inserts a punched card (programmed with his specific route) into a slot on the side wall of the car Control is then taken over "completely" by an electronic highway center The car's progress is marked on

a strip map projected on a radar-like screen on the front console.

Other innovations include a TV screen that provides a panoramic view of the road behind (eliminating the need for a rear window and side view mirror) and a luggage compartment with an electronic system for raising and lowering the floor for easy access.

You can't buy a Century Cruiser today But from the way our research has been going, who knows about the future?







