

SAITA IST By Raymond Marshall


Sometimes you just have to take the Corvette out for a drive. Pacific Coast Corvettes members Gene and Vickie Insley (*were run out of town*) voluntarily moved to Santa Rosa California a while back to be near their granddaughter. This move provided the opportunity for Nancy and I to go for a drive.

The car we took is Nancy's 2018 Yellow Z06. We left my 2008 Yellow Z06 at home in the garage. Neither one of our cars is a stranger to road trips. The 2008 joined the Corvette Caravan to Bowling Green in 2014. The 2018 was a museum delivery and we drove it home from Bowling Green in 2017 and it joined the Corvette Caravan in 2019 for another trip to Bowling Green. On this trip, we drove 1006 miles, got 25.7 miles per gallon at an average speed of 53 miles per hour.

Another place we have always commented about was Pea Soup Anderson's in Buelton. We pass it all the time while traveling up the 101 to Cambria. It is notable because there are signs along the freeway for many miles and Nancy and I are not pea soup fans. We cannot even fathom why a restaurant would feature pea soup. This is only important to the article on this trip because as we were driving up the 5 on Tuesday I had to stop and make a golf reservation at exactly 11:00. Guess where we were at 10:45 on Tuesday? We stopped to make the reservation at Pea Soup Anderson's in Santa Nella. We thought that was funny. We did not eat there.

Back on the road we continued up the 5. We took the 5 up to Hwy 12 in Lodi. At that point we stopped to get gas and had lunch at Arby's. The trip on the 12 is "interesting". The first bunch of miles is highlighted by a road that it is one lane in each direction separated by K-rails in the center and no shoulder on the right. Be careful, on the grounds they have a kite eating tree. While we were there we walked across the parking lot to Snoopy's Home Ice. This ice skating rink was built in 1969 by Peanuts creator Charles M. Schulz.

Somehow we survived until Thursday, time to go to see the Golden Gate Bridge. Nancy and I had been there before but it was about 30 years ago. Gene and Vickie took us to the Golden Gate National Recreation Area in the hills on the north side of the Golden Gate Bridge. The scenery is spectacular (it was not foggy when we were there). After looking at the bridge and walking around for a while we went to the old Nike Missile base that is in the hills. Gene and I did a good job of looking at all the mechan-



ical goodies they have. We went down into a large room where the missiles were stored and we were able to see them raise the missile like it was going to be launched. Our docent told us many interesting stories about the base and the missiles. After the site seeing we went to Petaluma and

golf business. After golf and lounging it was off to VJB Cellars for Pizza in Kenwood. A nice little winery done up in an Italian theme. The pizza was very good, but we got there too late for the gelato stand to be open.





Somewhere along the way we went for breakfast at Hank's Creekside Café in Santa Rosa. A very nice place that Gene said was not too crowded. After a half hour wait we finally got a table and had a very nice breakfast. Sitting out front and waiting for a table gave us a chance to talk because we had not yakked enough yet.

LØØKING BACK

In 1976 this mid-engine concept car was given the green light to be the new 1980 C4 Corvette.



Zora Arcus-Duntov was always pushing for a mid-engine design but was unable to make any headway with GM's management. So frustrated he retired in 1975.

In 1976 a year before his own retirement Bill Mitchell, GM's styling boss, decided a mid-engine Corvette was the way to go for the future after all. He moved this prototype (pictured here) out of storage and had it fitted

with a 400 cubic inch Chevrolet V8 replacing the 4 rotor experimental rotary engine that was in the car. Despite having the green light on this upcoming midengine C4 Corvette Zora's replacement, Dave McLellan, decided to stick to the tried and true front engine configuration. The front engine C4 Corvette we know of today was developed. It ended up dominating SCCA racing in the mid 1980s and culminated with a 375 horse ZR-1 model in 1990.

This prototype, AEROVETTE by name, remains in the GM Heritage Collection joined by other significant vehicles.




