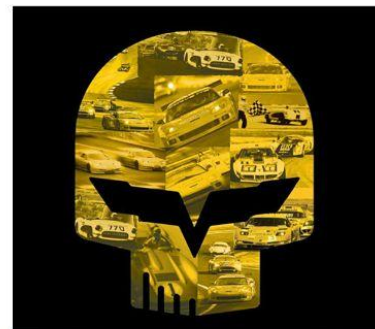

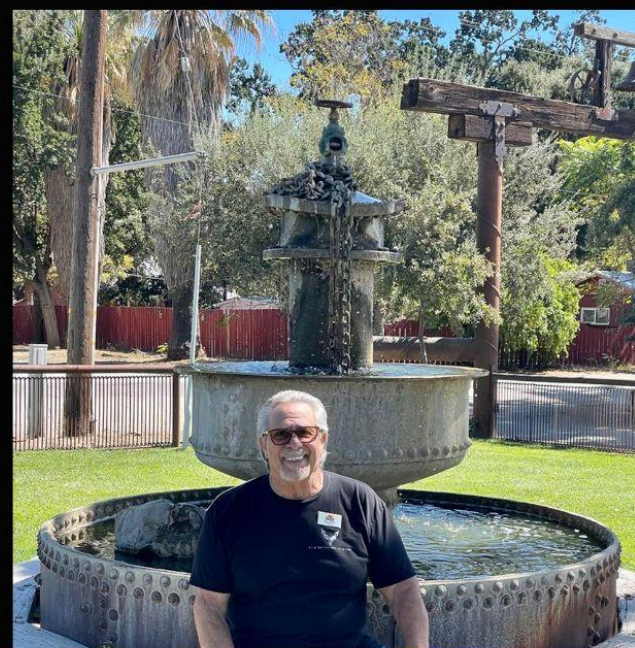
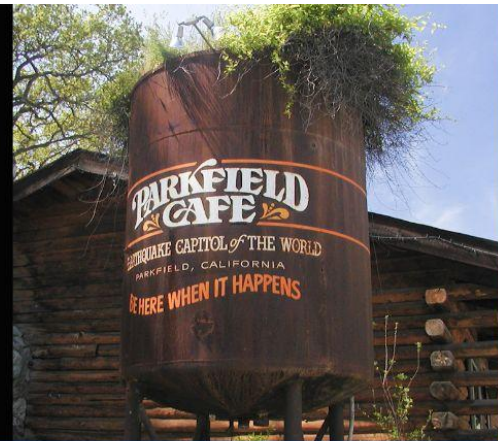
# Cambria 2023 Parkfield Cafe Luncheon

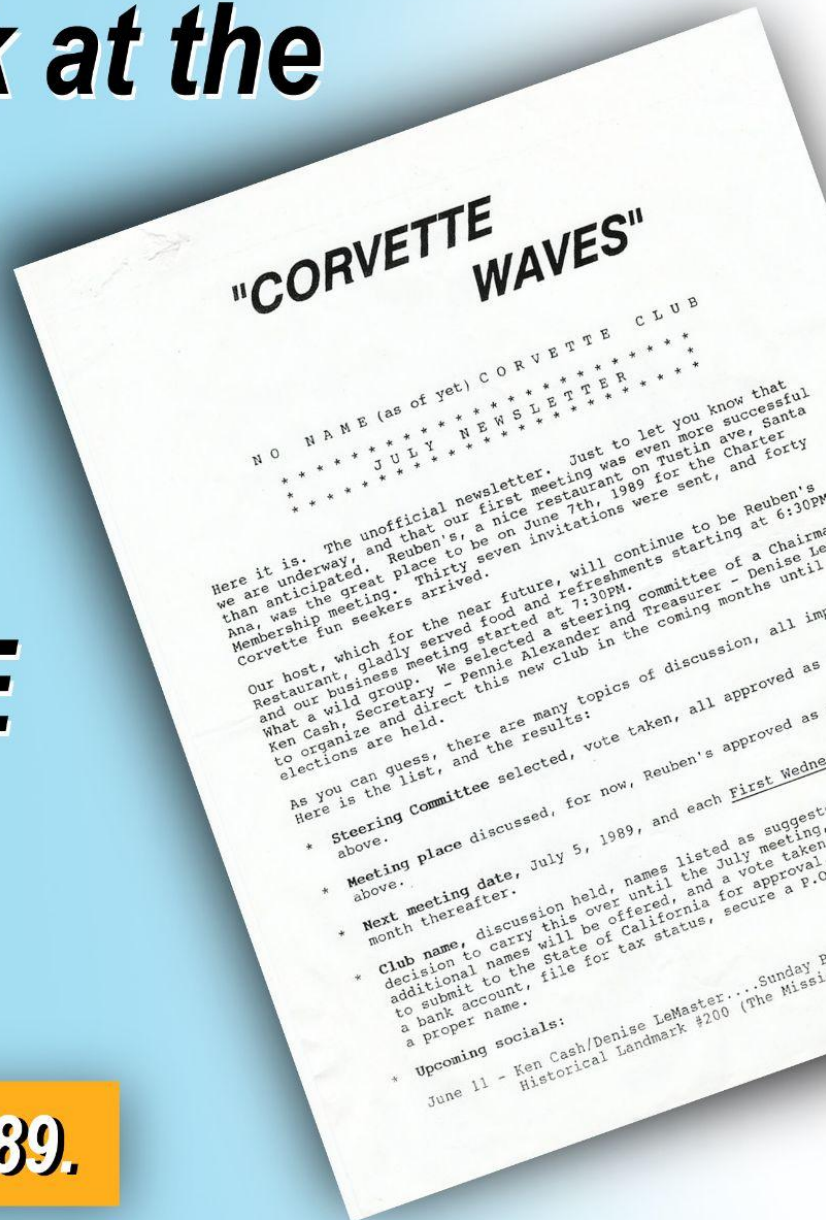

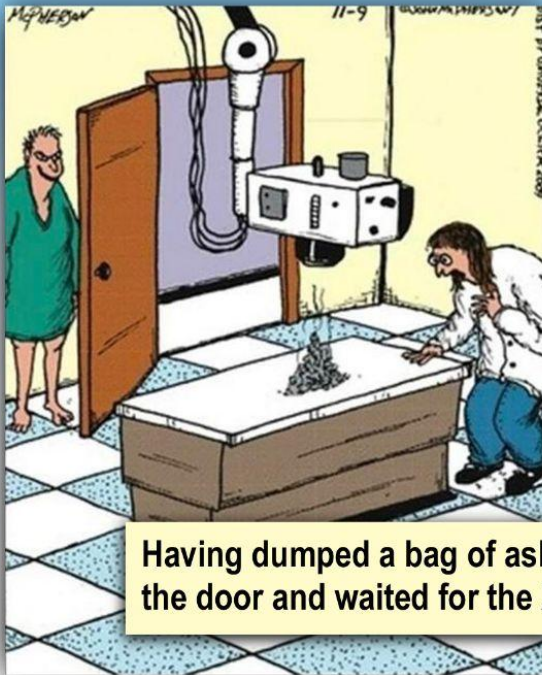

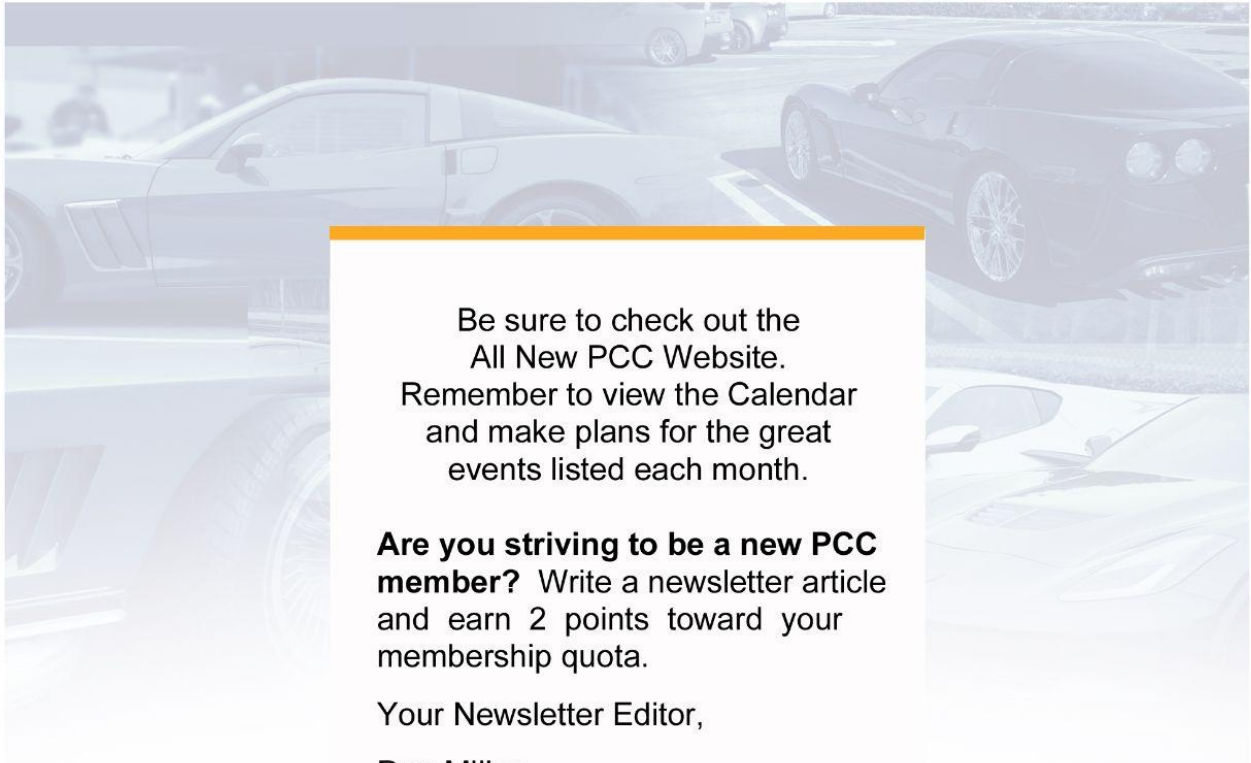
